SECTION: Transportation Services
SUBJECT: Dust Abatement Past Residences in Special Areas

Dust abatement will be provided by the Special Areas Board on roadways past ratepayer residences upon receipt of a written request from the resident and approved by the Board.

The dust abatement materials used are the spraying of calcium lignosulfinate or crude oil.

The maximum length per site will be One Thousand (1,000) feet.

The preparation of the road surface and the application of the material will be by the Special Areas Board or a designated representative.

The Special Areas Board will provide the required maintenance to these sites.

If the site is deemed unsafe for public travel or beyond reasonable maintenance, the Special Areas Board will revert the site to a gravel condition.


The cost of the preparation of the sites and the application of materials to the sites will be shared on a 50/50 basis between the Special Areas Board and the resident.

The Special Areas Board will provide the resident with the appropriate invoice upon completion of the work.

The Special Areas Board will not be responsible for any failure of dust abatement at any site. The resident must reapply for each application.

The Special Areas Board will, when determined necessary, apply dust abatement past residences in the form of watering on the roadway when extensive gravel hauling is carried out from certain gravel pits or stockpiles. This will only apply during the haul and any further application will have to be applied under the cost sharing aspect of this program.

Ratepayers to be invoiced for 50% of the cost in accordance with the "Policy for Dust Abatement Past Residences in Special Areas". Ratepayers are required to sign a declaration prior to application.
