


## Special Area No. 2

## CONNECTED TO GLOBAL MARKETS



Special Area No. 2 has a variety of highly successful farming operations. True mixed farms are now moving more to either farming or ranching as owners become more efficient at these disciplines. Tame pasture and hay make up the majority of acreage, representing the strong cattle industry that supports much of the rural population. Grain production accounts for a light percentage of land use with wheat, barley, canola and oats being the main field crops in the area. In additional to traditional cattle operations, modern hog operations and a growing lamb industry contribute to the agricultural diversity of the region.

The Town of Hanna has an agricultural service center for a trading area of over 10,000 people and is home to: Cervus Equipment, UFA Farm Supply, Prairie Seeds, Hanna Building Supplies and Fox Lake Agro Service.

Special Area No 2 is located in Southeast Alberta and the main east-west route in the region is Highway 9, which is part of Alberta's high load corridor. The main north-south route is Highway 36. These highways are primary provincial routes for trucking and transport. Hanna Municipal Airport has a 3,500-foot runway, and the nearest commercial and air freight services are at Calgary

International Airport.
