


Special Area No. 3

CONNECTED TO GLOBAL MARKETS



Farms in the Special Area No. 3 region are generally mixed with ranching and grain production. Grain production accounts for a high percentage of land use with wheat being the main field crop in the area. Other common grains include canola, barley and oats.

The region, which includes the Town of Oyen, is home to 650 farm families and a total farm area of 1.8 million acres.

Dryland farming techniques and maximizing moisture retention have transformed the area into a region conducive for field crops.

Special Area No. 3 is located in Southeast Alberta and the main eastwest route in the region is Highway 9, a high load corridor that links to Saskatchewan. The main north-south route is Highway 41. These highways are primary routes for provincial trucking and transportation. The Oyen Municipal Airport has a 3,000-foot runway, and the nearest commercial and air freight services are located at Calgary International Airport. The area is served by CN Railways.
