#### Municipal Partnerships

- Special Areas continues to enjoy strong partnerships with regional neighbors
  - These relationships include rural and urban municipalities
- We have formalized these partnerships in Intermunicipal Collaboration Framework Agreements (ICF)
- A key initiative in 2023 is to work with urban neighbors to look at opportunities to strengthen these relationships
  - Includes looking at potential partnership projects, regional priorities, and industrial tax transfer funding



Acadia Foundation - Oyen Lodge Expansion

- Concept of developing an Assisted Living/Dementia Care facility in Oyen has been in development for many years
- The Government of Alberta is funding the project through a capital grant to the Acadia Foundation
  - Acadia Foundation will be the lead project proponent through development and construction
  - Special Areas will assist with financing and funding the project
- The current concept involves a 14-unit single story facility connected directly to the Oyen Lodge
- Anticipated to begin construction in Fall 2023, with substantial completion early 2025



Big Country Hospital (Oyen) - Update

### The problem?

 On Jan 10, 2023, AHS temporarily closed 10 acute care beds and limited emergency department (closed from 7pm to 7 am)

## How has Special Areas helped resolve this issue?

- Worked with Town of Oyen and MD Acadia to advocate with AHS and the Province to restore services
- Meetings with Minister of Health, AHS Senior Leadership, and local medical & support staff
- Investigating/funding solutions to secure medivac services into the Oyen Municipal Airport
- Partnering with stakeholders in region to provide housing and residences to contract nursing staff.

#### Current status?

 April 7, 2023 - Emergency department service resumes and 50% of acute care beds reopen (5 out of 10)




MD Acadia and Special Areas Joint Irrigation Project

- Joint project with Government of Alberta, Canada Infrastructure Bank, MD of Acadia and Special Areas:
  - Phase 1 work finished with report in 2022 (pre-feasibility)
  - Concluded 'green-field' (new) development of irrigation for 108,000 acres is feasible in the MD Acadia and Special Areas
  - Report available on <u>www.specialareas.ab.ca</u>
- Fall 2022, project partners announced \$7M funding for Phase 2 work for regional irrigation project:
  - Phase 2 work includes preliminary engineering design, environmental and regulatory considerations and potential financing options
  - Spring 2023 project management procured and selection of engineering firm for Phase 2 work
- Goal of Phase 2 work is to identify if the project is feasible for development and construction

Tax Recovery Land Sale Policy Update

- In 2021, Advisory Council and the Special Areas Board developed a *DRAFT* Tax Recovery Land Sale (TRLS) policy based on prior TRLS in the Special Areas
- Advisory Council and the Board recommended the DRAFT TRLS policy be shared with the Minister of Municipal Affairs in 2022 to seek a Ministerial Order for approval
- Special Areas is waiting for a response from the Minister's Office
