FISHING: A RICH TRADITION

With the Blood Indian dam constructed in 1965 and stocked annually with rainbow trout, and now brook, brown, and tiger trout, our reservoir is a great family fishing destination. Despite the challenges posed by invasive species, the spirit of angling thrives here.



PRESERVE AND ENJOY

We are stewards of the land and guardians of our history. Help us preserve the beauty of Blood Indian Park by following our guidelines:

- + Respect wildlife and plant life.
- + Follow the graveled roads and designated trails.
- + Block your unit up to level it. Do not dig holes.
- + If there is not an existing fire pit at your campsite, do not make a new one.
- All boats on trailers (except those that can be carried) must be launched and loaded at one of the designated boat launches.
- No ATV's are to be used in the Park.
- + Keep pets under control and clean up after them.
- Observe quiet hours from 11:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. for the peace of all guests.
- + 60/30 RULE: Only generators rated 60 decibels at 30 feet, allowed.
- When Fire Hazard rating permits the use of fireworks, it is restricted to the shoreline of the East, West, and North Blocks.

Non-compliance is deterred by eviction and/or fines.

EMBRACE THE GREAT OUTDOORS

Blood Indian Park offers an array of activities for everyone:

- + **Trails and Nature:** Explore the Grasslands Nature Trail for breathtaking vistas and wildlife sightings.
- Spray Park: Enjoy our spray park with large, attached playground with rubberized flooring.
 - + Remember, the **Spray Park** is **unsupervised**, so adult supervision is recommended.
 - + Hours of operation: 12:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. daily from first weekend in June to first weekend in September
- Water Activities: Peaceful and calm waters support all kinds of water recreation, from paddling, to kayaking, to fishing from the shore or your boat, with a 12 km/hr speed limit, guaranteeing calm water.
- Facilities: From boat launches and trailer dumps to firewood sales and potable water, we've got your needs covered.


The Park is open year-round with limited services. Check-in time in the serviced sites is 2:00 p.m.
