Special Areas Board Governance

- Board members are appointed by Order in Council
 - Jordon Christianson, Chair (Expires September 14, 2025)
 - Brad Slorstad, Board member (Expires April 30, 2026)
 - Kevin Wilson, Board member (Expires April 30, 2026)
 - Douglas Noble, Board member (Expires April 30, 2026)
- Daryl Swenson moved off the Board April 2024 as he had served for ten years (as per APAGA)
 - Daryl continues to represent Special Area 2 Subdivision 7 on the Advisory Council
- Kevin Wilson (SA3-SD6) was selected by Advisory Council to represent Special Area No. 3 on the Board



Municipal Partnerships

- Special Areas continues to enjoy strong partnerships with regional neighbors
 - These relationships include rural and urban municipalities
- A key ongoing initiative is working with urban neighbors located within Special Areas to identify opportunities for strengthening these relationships
 - Potential partnership projects
 - Industrial Tax Transfer funding (doubled in 2023)
 - Regional approach to emergency management
 - Inter Municipal Collaboration Frameworks



Acadia Foundation - Oyen Lodge Expansion

- Concept of developing an Assisted Living/Dementia Care facility in Oyen has been in development for many years
 - Current concept involves a 14-unit single story facility connected directly to the Oyen Lodge
 - DSL4/4D spaces support assisted living & dementia care
- The Government of Alberta is funding the project through a capital grant to the Acadia Foundation
 - Estimated cost \$11.7M
 - Acadia Foundation is leading project
 - Special Areas is assisting with funding the project
- Construction started early 2024
 - The project is expected to take 18 months to complete



Nurse Practitioner Pilot Project - Consort

- Consort & District Medical Centre Board is piloting a Nurse Practitioner program to help enhance medical services available in the community
 - Identified through engagement with the local community
- Special Areas is supporting the pilot program for two years
 - Special Areas is engaging with the Province to help secure sustainable long-term funding for this innovative program
- The Consort & District Medical Centre Board has recruited a Rural Primary Healthcare Nurse Practitioner who will be starting to practice in Consort this summer



MD of Acadia & Special Areas Irrigation Project

- Joint project with Government of Alberta, Canada Infrastructure Bank, MD of Acadia and Special Areas
- Phase 1 work finished with report in 2022 (pre-feasibility)
 - Concluded 'green-field' (new) development of irrigation for 108,000 acres is feasible
- Phase 2 work underway
 - Phase 2 work includes preliminary engineering design, environmental and regulatory considerations and potential financing options
 - Goal of Phase 2 work is to identify if the project is feasible for development and construction
 - Expected to be completed in early 2025



Tax Recovery Land Sale Policy

- In 2021, Advisory Council and the Special Areas Board developed a *DRAFT* Tax Recovery Land Sale (TRLS) policy based on prior TRLS in the Special Areas
- Advisory Council and the Board recommended the 2023 TRLS policy to the Minister of Municipal Affairs in 2022 to seek a *Ministerial Order* for approval
- Minister approved the 2023 TRLS policy in July 2023
- Policy expires on July 16, 2026
